Current Giving Trends





Executive Summary

- Concise overview of the project.
- Example: A brief summary of a community health initiative.

Statement of Need


- Demonstrating the problem or need for your project addresses.
- Example: Statistics and evidence supporting the need for a new educational program.

Project Description

- Detailed explanation of the project, including objectives, methods, and timeline.
- Example: A step-by-step plan for a conservation project.

Mastering the Art of Budgeting

Budget

Evaluation Plan


- Methods for measuring project success and impact.

- Example: Strategies for securing future funding or community support.






Writing Tips and Common Pitfalls

- Use active voice and strong verbs.
- Learn sector specific buzzwords/ buzz phrases and use them.


Common Pitfalls

- Ignoring guidelines.
- Overlooking deadlines.
- Failing to proofread.
